Public Health Alert: Informational update

Stav at Home Order – Executive Order # No. 20-03

The public health and safety of our community is our primary concern. Despite sustained efforts, COVID-19 still remains a threat and further efforts to control the spread of the virus to reduce and minimize the spread of infection are needed. All people must do their part to SLOW THE SPREAD of this virus by strictly adhering to the guidance of The Center for Disease Control and Prevention, along with our Tribal Council, and Pascua Yaqui's Incident Command System.

Stay at Home Order for the Pascua Yaqui Pueblo is in effect until May 31, 2020 at 6:00 A.M.

- 1) All individuals residing on the Pascua Yaqui Reservation are ordered to stay at home or their current place of residence, except as may be required for medical treatment, food, or safety for themselves or their family members. When leaving your home to obtain these essential services, as few people should leave the home as possible.
- 2) A curfew is in effect from 9:00 p.m. 6:00 a.m.
- 3) All parks and non-essential public places of gathering are closed
- 4) All public and private gatherings of any number of people occurring at a single household or living unit are prohibited, except for the limited purposes expressly permitted in the executive order
- 5) There shall be no gatherings of more than 10 people
- 6) Food or Candy sales out of trucks or residence are prohibited

Exceptions of the stay at home and curfew orders are provided as follows

- For employment and or to volunteer
- To perform your cultural obligations
