Public Health Alert: Staying Safe This Holiday Season

As the holiday season approaches, The Pascua Yaqui Tribe Health Services Division (PYTHSD) is offering special considerations to help protect the health of the tribal community. It is important to assess COVID-19 and Influenza levels within the community to determine if you should postpone, cancel, or limit the number of attendees during a holiday gathering. These considerations should be used in addition-not replace- any tribal health and safety laws, rules, and regulations.

Special Considerations:

- Assess current community levels of COVID-19 and Influenza (the flu). Higher levels of the virus can increase the risk and spread of the infection among attendees.
- Holiday gatherings that are indoor could pose a health risk. Additionally, indoor gatherings with poor ventilation could further the risk of infection.
- Gatherings that last longer pose more risk than shorter gatherings.
- The number of people attending a gathering could increase the chance of obtaining the viruses. Holiday celebrations with more people can be an increase health threat to attendees.
- Attendees travelling to holiday parties outside of their own community can increase the risk of infection.
- If you are experiencing a dry cough, shortness of breath, or fever over 100.0 F and think you may have COVID-19 please call to complete screening: 520-334-7691 or 520-879-5652
